W NPM Vs YARN Vs PNPM

pnpm is our third package manager that is not as commonly used.



If you have multiple npm projects on your computer, pnpm will store all node_modules from different projects in one central location.

This means whenever you npm install, if you have already previously installed a particular dependency somewhere, you:

- Save time by not having to download it
- Save hard disk space by not having to install it



Usually the downsides of pnpm are more edge cases, but they include:

- Libraries that generate code into the node_modules folder after installation may break due to the centralised linking nature of pnpm.
- Some people can be less familiar with it compared to the usual npm or yarn.
